OMB has requested comments on the attached draft *Memorandum for the Heads of Departments and Agencies*. The subject is *"Interim Implementation Guidance for the Justice40 Initiative"* (interim guidance).

The Justice40 initiative was established under <u>Executive Order 14008</u>, *Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad* (January 27, 2021), which directed the OMB Director, the Chair of the Council on Environmental Quality and the National Climate Advisor, in consultation with the White House Environmental Justice Advisory Council, to jointly publish guidance on how certain Federal investments might be made toward a goal that 40 percent of the overall benefits of such investments flow to disadvantaged communities. The attached guidance provides initial recommendations pursuant to section 223 of Executive Order 14008.
