Shooter arrived at rally security screening area more than 3 hours before assassination attempt

By 3 p.m. on Saturday, Thomas Matthew Crooks was at the security screening area for the Donald Trump rally in Butler County, Pennsylvania.

He first aroused suspicion when he passed through the magnetometers carrying a rangefinder, which looks similar to a small pair of binoculars and is used by hunters and target shooters to measure distances when setting up a long-range shot, according to a senior law enforcement official briefed on the investigation. The rangefinder would not have prevented Crooks from getting through the security screening point, but it did attract the attention of security personnel who kept an eye on him until he left the secure area.

Investigators are unsure of where Crooks went after he left the screening area but the working theory is that he went to his car to retrieve the rifle.

Around the same time witnesses alerted police that Crooks was crawling on the roof, one of the four counter-sniper teams observed Crooks looking at their position through the rangefinder, according to the senior law enforcement official.

"They were looking at him while he was looking at them," the official said.

Tracking the Trump rally gunman's movements leading up to his attack

In the 48 hours before he opened fire on former President Donald Trump, 20-year-old Thomas Matthew Crooks made a series of stops in and around his suburban Pittsburgh hometown.

On Friday, he went to a shooting range where he was a member, and practiced firing, a law enforcement official told CNN. The next morning, Crooks went to a Home Depot, where he bought a five-foot ladder, and a gun store, where he purchased 50 rounds of ammunition, the official said.

Secret Service killed Trump rally shooter 26 seconds after first shot:

Law enforcement officials investigating the assassination attempt on Donald Trump told lawmakers today in an unclassified briefing that 20 minutes passed between the time Secret Service snipers first spotted Crooks on the roof and the time shots were fired at the former president, according to several law enforcement officials and lawmakers briefed on the matter.

According to this source, briefers said the snipers spotted him on the roof at 5:52 p.m. ET. The shooting happened at 6:12 p.m., 20 minutes later.

The briefing was conducted by the FBI Director, his Deputy Director and the head of the USSS.

In addition, briefers told lawmakers Crooks was identified as a person of interest a full 62 minutes before the shooting took place.

Gunman was a loner, had been 'bullied' a little 'but not over the top':

Investigators have found that Thomas Matthew Crooks, the 20-year-old gunman, was a loner without friends and was described as "odd," according to multiple sources briefed on the investigation. Crooks had been "bullied" a little, "but not over the top," one source said.

Analysts are trying to assess whether he was hard to get close to or was shut off because he was hiding something, sources said.

Investigators haven't found any helpful information on Crooks' phone or computer and are looking to see if he may have used "burners" or other devices, sources said.

Crooks seen walking around near magnetometers before shooting: Minutes before the shooting, gunman Thomas Matthew Crooks was seen walking around near the magnetometers and people reported him as suspicious, according to law enforcement sources.

When someone in law enforcement started to approach Crooks, the 20-year-old backed up and faded into the crowd, according to sources.

Crooks then climbed on top of air conditioning units and pulled himself up to the roof of the building beside those units, sources said. Once on the roof of that first building, he worked his way toward another taller, adjacent building that gave him the vantage point to fire in Donald Trump's direction, sources said. He jumped and landed where he wanted to be and slowly made his way to the summit of the sloped building, sources said.

Secret Service agents heard radio traffic about a suspicious person and later heard another radio dispatch about some sort of confrontation with police, sources said. When bystanders noticed Crooks, an officer climbed up, sources said. Crooks pointed his gun at the officer who fell to the ground, sources said.

There were police personnel and snipers from the local countersniper units in the building where Crooks eventually took up a position to fire at Trump, sources said. Investigators believe that could have led to confusion as Secret Service snipers were trying to determine whether there was a threat to Trump and where it might be coming from.

The Secret Service sharpshooters knew that building was being used by law enforcement and, investigators believe, that might have led to a split-second delay in reacting as the Secret Service snipers had to figure out whether the man on the roof was an officer or a suspect, sources said.

Authorities detail how they suspect the gunman reached roof; motive still a mystery:

Authorities suspect Thomas Matthew Crooks, the man they allege tried to assassinate former President Trump, was able to access the roof by climbing over an air conditioning

unit adjacent to the building, sources tell ABC News. Though law enforcement sources say Crooks is believed to have purchased a 5-foot ladder at a Home Depot before the shooting, it does not appear to have been used to climb on the roof and was not found at the scene.

Investigators found a remote transmitter in the suspect's pocket that may have been intended to set off two suspicious devices found in the suspect's car and one in his home, according to law enforcement sources.

Devices at both locations were similarly constructed in ammunition containers using components including receivers that appear to have been paired with the remote control found in the suspect's pocket, sources said....

...The shooter also asked his employer if he could take a day off on Saturday but said he would return to work perhaps as soon as Sunday, the day after this attack, according to law enforcement sources. But thus far, investigators have turned up nothing to suggest that he had any accomplices or other support to carry out his deadly objective.

An examination of his phone, which the FBI has now unlocked, has not turned up any significant information about the suspect's motives -- only what sources described as "routine" information for a 20-year-old male. A suspected gunman who opened fire during a Trump rally Saturday in Butler, Pennsylvania, was fatally shot by a Secret Service sniper, authorities said.

One rally attendee was killed and two more were critically wounded, the Secret Service said in a statement Saturday night.

The suspect was shot and killed by a member of a Secret Service counter-assault team, two law enforcement sources told CBS News.

Multiple law enforcement sources said the gunman was outside of the cordoned-off rally area, about 400 feet from the stage, and was on top of a shed, the two sources said. The shooter was armed with a semiautomatic AR-style rifle, the sources said. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives is tracing the weapon....(Article continues)

Attendees who spotted the suspected shooter, 20-year-old Thomas Matthew Crooks, with the items notified law enforcement, sources said.

Additionally, Crooks had two cell phones, one on him and a second one found at his home, sources said.
